<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Perform and document a full or focused history and physical examination (1,2,3,4) • Develop a differential diagnosis (1,2,3) • Develop and document a diagnostic strategy (1,2,3,4,5) • Develop and document a treatment plan (1,2,3,4,5,6) • Order diagnostic tests (1,2,3) • Order medications (1,2,3,4) • Order appropriate consults (1,2,3,4,5) • Demonstrate effective interpersonal skills with patient and medical personnel (1,3,4,5,6) • Demonstrate ethical and professional behavior (2,3,6) • Use information technology for self-education and improvement of patient care (1,2,3,5) • Teaching medical students and junior trainees the principles of Sleep Medicine, provide instruction in therapy and diagnosis of Sleep Medicine, and teach during clinics and in conferences (1,3,4) • Counsel patients compassionately and effectively about the pathophysiology and possible repercussions of Sleep Medicine disorders (2,4,6) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prior to completing an inpatient or outpatient Sleep Medicine encounter, the Fellow will discuss the patient with the Sleep Medicine Faculty attending (3,4,6) • The Sleep Medicine Fellow may begin or recommend specific interventions and therapies before the final patient review with the Sleep Medicine Faculty Attending (1,2,3) • Polysomnograms, CPAP titration studies, Multiple Sleep Latency tests and other sleep diagnostic modalities will be reviewed with Sleep Medicine Faculty Attending before a report is dictated or final recommendations are made (1,2,3,4,6)
