<p>The resident</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is capable of total patient care and coordination of arrangement in outpatient and inpatient environment (1,2,4,6) • Capable of directing pre and post operative care and evaluations of multiple patients (1,2,4,6) • Understands operative procedures and approaches to colon and rectal surgical problems and is capable of choosing the appropriate choice (1,2,4,6,) • Has the ability to provide critical care based on principle of critical care (1,2,4,6,) • Knows and understands the principles of suture anastomosis and stapling devices (1,2,3,5) • Is able to coordinate care between multiple consultants in an appropriate manner (1,2,3,4,5,6) • Able to manage the service in an administrative manner so as to provide educational environment for residents and students.
