

**Skin:**

**Early Reactions:**

1. Redness, irritation, or soreness.
2. Scaliness, ulceration, crusting, oozing, discharge.
3. Hair loss.
4. These reactions are likely to be intensified by chemotherapy.

**Late Reactions:**

1. Changes in skin texture causing scaly or shiny smooth skin, thickening, with contracture, puckering, scarring of skin.
2. Changes in skin color or overall appearance.
3. Prominent dilated small blood vessels.
4. Loss of sweating in treated area.
5. Permanent hair loss.
6. Chronic or recurrent ulceration. Severe damage may require skin grafting or plastic surgery.
7. Damage to adjacent tissues, including underlying bone or cartilage.
8. Possible injury may occur from trauma, sun, or frostbite unless the treated area is forever protected.
9. In children, second cancers may develop in the irradiated area.
